
REGULATIONS OF GDYNIA KIDS RUN (HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS: EVENT")

ORGANIZATOR

The organizer of the event is Sport Evolution Group Sp. z o.o., located at 12/23 Jana Kochanowskiego Street, 01-864 Warsaw, registered in the National Court Register under the number 0000779253, with the registration court: District Court for the capital city of Warsaw, XIII Economic Department of the National Court Register, NIP (Tax Identification Number): 1231431002, REGON (National Business Registry Number): 382960037, **correspondence address: Falencka 1B, 05-090 Raszyn (hereinafter referred to as the "organizer")**.

I. DATE AND PLACE

1. The event will take place on April 25, 2026, in Gdynia.
2. The start time of the event will be published in the "Schedule" section on <http://www.gdyniapolmaraton.pl> (hereinafter referred to as the "event website").

II. COURSE.

1. Zawody odbędą się na dystansach:
 - a. Girls and boys aged 2 – 4: 150 meter run (born in 2024 – 2022)
 - b. Girls and boys aged 5 – 6: 300 meter run (born in 2021 – 2020)
 - c. Girls and boys aged 7 – 8: 300 meter run (born in 2019 – 2018)
 - d. Girls and boys aged 9 – 10: 600 meter run (born in 2017 – 2016)
 - e. Girls and boys aged 11 – 12: 600 meter run (born in 2015 – 2014)
 - f. Girls and boys aged 13 – 14: 1000 meter run (born in 2013 – 2012)
2. The detailed race route will be posted on the website www.gdyniapolmarathon.pl (hereinafter referred to as the "event website"). The Organizer reserves the right to change the route and its length. Such a change does not constitute grounds for requesting a refund of the entry fee or any compensation, provided that the change is made for important organizational or safety reasons.
3. Aside from the Organizer, authorized persons, and public services, no individuals without a race number are allowed on the course. Those violating this rule may be removed from the course by appropriate services.

4. Electronic time measurement checkpoints will be located along the course. Skipping a checkpoint, as well as running on the sidewalk, grass, or any part of the road not designated as the race course, may result in disqualification.

III. SAFETY

1. In the interest of the safety of athletes, volunteers, and organizers during the event, all participants and spectators must adhere to the current epidemic guidelines available on the website www.gov.pl (if applicable).
2. Persons under quarantine, under epidemiological supervision, or exhibiting symptoms of infection (fever, cough, shortness of breath) are prohibited from attending the event.
3. The athletes declare awareness of the level of risk associated with being in a crowded place during the event, including the risks of viral infection.
4. The athlete declares that they will not make any claims against the organizer in the event of any infection acquired during the event.
5. The athlete participates solely under the responsibility of a parent or legal guardian. The parent or legal guardian assumes the associated risk, acknowledging that participation in the Event involves physical exertion and carries inherent risks, including the possibility of accidents, bodily injuries, and physical harm (including death), as well as property damage and losses. By allowing participation, they voluntarily accept these risks. The above does not exclude the Organizer's liability as stipulated by mandatory legal regulations. .
6. The organizer provides personal accident insurance (NNW) to participants who have been correctly verified at the race office. Each athlete will be covered by insurance for personal accident protection, covering bodily injury or health impairment resulting in permanent disability or death of the insured, occurring during the insurer's liability period in the territory of the Republic of Poland. The premium is paid by the Policyholder, i.e., the Organizer.
7. Athletes are obliged to strictly follow the instructions of the Organizers, traffic management services, including the Police, Municipal Guard, judges, and other services securing the race route.
8. Medical service decisions regarding the continuation of the race are final and indisputable. The medical transport of an athlete results in disqualification.
9. If an athlete decides to withdraw from the race at any point in the event, they are obligated to report this fact to the judges or the organizer. Failure to report this fact to the judges or the organizer may result in the athlete being disqualified and suspended from participating in events organized by Sport Evolution Group Sp. z o.o. for 2 years.

IV. PARTICIPATION

1. Participation is open to individuals born between 2012 and 2024.
2. Every Athelte must be verified at the event office. Details regarding participant verification can be found in Section VIII.
3. For safety reasons, the following are prohibited:
 - a. Bringing items onto the course that could pose a threat to other participants.
 - b. Participating in attire that covers the face and prevents identification.
 - c. Participating with animals.
 - d. Participating with strollers or child carriers.
4. The Organizer may prohibit the use of items not specified in Section IV, Point 3, if they pose a risk to the safety of athletes, volunteers, or the Organizer.
5. Only verified participants with a race number may be on the course. Running with a companion is not allowed, except as specified in this regulation.
6. Costs related to the entry fee, accommodations, transportation, and meals are the responsibility of the participant.
7. Each athlete is required to display their race number on the front of their chest. Failure to comply may result in disqualification.

V. REGISTRATION

1. Registration for the event will be conducted through a registration form available on SlotMarket.pl from January 1, 2026, to April 19, 2026, or until all entries are filled.
2. The participant limit for the event is 1000 entries. If the limit is reached, the Organizer reserves the right to close registration earlier.
3. The Organizer reserves the right to invite individuals to participate in the event even after the limit is reached or after the registration deadline mentioned in Point 1 of Section V.
4. The Organizer reserves the right to modify the participant limit; however, anyone registered before such a change is announced will retain their right to participate.
5. Registration is considered valid upon submission of a correctly completed registration form and payment of the current entry fee, available in the user's registration profile on SlotMarket.pl.
6. Confirmation of successful registration includes:
 - a. A registration confirmation from SlotMarket.pl (sent from contact@slotmarket.pl);
 - b. A payment confirmation from the Przelewy24 portal;
 - c. Registration information in the "Registration History" section of the user's SlotMarket.pl account (status: "Registered").

VI. ENTRY FEE

1. The entry fee for participating in the event, depending on the payment order, is as follows:
 - a. First 250 entries – 30.00 PLN
 - b. Next 250 entries – 40.00 PLN
 - c. Last 500 entries – 50.00 PLN
 - d. At the event office – 70.00 PLN (subject to availability)
2. The entry fee must be paid via the Przelewy24 transaction service. All payment data is entered on a secure, encrypted page.
3. The fee must be paid during registration; otherwise, the application will be canceled.
4. The entry fee includes pre-event athlete support (email communication and social media), server maintenance and website operation, equipment purchase and rental for organizing the event, the starter pack, event organization, and promotion.
5. An athlete who wishes to receive an invoice for the entry fee must select the appropriate option in the registration form and provide the required details for issuing the document. The invoice will be automatically generated after payment is processed and will be available for download in the participant's profile on SlotMarket.pl.
6. The Organizer does not issue paper invoices.
7. To request an invoice after payment, please contact faktury@sporteolution.pl.
8. Invoices for individuals will be issued within three months after payment.
9. Invoices for businesses will be issued by the 15th of the following month after payment.

VII. RACE PACKAGE

1. As part of the event, each athlete receives:
 - a. BIB number / race number
 - b. Chip
2. Athlete who finishes the race within the time limit are entitled to a medal.
3. A athlete who transfers the race package to another person, and a person who acquires a race package without reporting this fact to the organizer, may be disqualified and suspended from participating in events organized by Sport Evolution Group sp. Z o.o. for 2 years. Additionally, a participant using another person's package will not be covered by personal accident insurance.
4. Packages not collected during the race office's working hours may be sent to the athlete upon their request via courier to the address: biuro@gdyniapolmaraton.pl, within 7 days from the race day. Shipping costs are as follows:
 - a. Poland – 20 PLN

- b. European Union countries – 10 EUR,
 - c. Countries outside the European Union – 50 EUR
5. The participant covers the shipping cost before the shipment is processed.

VIII. RACE OFFICE, START LINE, FINISH LINE, DEPOSIT

RACE OFFICE / CHECK-IN

1. The race office will be located at Kościuszko Square in Gdynia on April 24 - 25, 2026.
2. The opening hours of the race office will be published on the event's website.
3. The athlete must check in at the race office during its opening hours.
4. Positive check-in at the race office requires presenting the registration confirmation in the form of a QR code and an identification document.
5. Minors are required to present a consent form from a parent or legal guardian during the race package pickup, or the parent/legal guardian will pick up the package based on the athlete's QR code. The parent/legal guardian consent form will be published on the event's website 30 days before the race.
6. The QR code necessary for check-in at the race office will be provided to the athlete a maximum of 3 days before the race to the email address provided during registration and will be published on the Slotmarket.pl portal in the athlete's account.
7. The opening hours and location of the race office may be subject to change. Such changes do not give rise to any additional claims or obligations. The exact opening hours and location of the race office will be provided on the event's website.
8. The opening hours and location of the Race Office may be subject to change. Such a change does not constitute grounds for requesting a refund of the entry fee or any compensation, provided that the change is made for important organizational or safety reasons. The exact opening hours and location of the Race Office will be announced on the <http://www.gdyniapolmaraton.pl/>.

START

1. The start line will be located on the Seaside Boulevard, at the level of the Fish Monument.
2. The start time will be published on the event website.
3. Parents or legal guardians are allowed to take part if children start in the 2–8 age categories. In this case, the parent or guardian should line up with the child at the back of the starting group.
4. The start format, its time and location, as well as the wave division, may be subject to change. Such a change does not constitute grounds for requesting a refund of the entry fee or any compensation, provided that the change is made for important organizational or safety

reasons. Exact information regarding the start and location will be provided on the <http://www.gdyniapolmaraton.pl/>.

FINISH LINE

1. The finish line will be located on the City Beach in Gdynia.
2. Only athletes who have crossed the finish line are allowed in the finish area. Upon crossing the finish line, the athlete will receive a commemorative medal.
3. Entering the finish area with a companion, or items that may pose a threat to the safety of the athlete or others is prohibited. Failure to comply with this rule may result in disqualification.
4. The finish line location may be subject to change. Such a change does not constitute grounds for requesting a refund of the entry fee or any compensation, provided that the change is made for important organizational or safety reasons.

IX. TRANSFER & WITHDRAWALS

In accordance with Article 38(1)(12) of the Consumer Rights Act, the athlete is not entitled to the right of withdrawal from the agreement to participate in the race.

1. In case of withdrawal from the race, the organizer will refund a portion of the entry fee according to the following schedule:
 - a. 50% of the entry fee until January 25, 2026.
 - b. 25% of the entry fee from January 26, 2026, to March 12, 2026.
 - c. From March 13, 2026 onward, the registration fee is non-refundable.
2. There is no possibility to transfer the entry fee to another year.
3. To withdraw, please send an email to biuro@gdyniapolmaraton.pl.

XI. KLASYFIKACJA I WYNIKI

1. The following classifications will be conducted during the event:
 - a. Girls and boys aged 2–4
 - b. Girls and boys aged 5 – 6
 - c. Girls and boys aged 7 – 8
 - d. Girls and boys aged 9 – 10
 - e. Girls and boys aged 11 – 12
 - f. Girls and boys aged 13 – 14
2. Classification is determined by the year of birth.
3. The official race time is the participant's gross time.
4. The top three finishers in each classification will receive commemorative trophies.

5. The results will be announced no later than 15 minutes before the award ceremony. The results will be available on the timing company's website.
6. The results will be published on the event website and provided to the media for information.
7. If an athlete is not present at the award ceremony, prizes may be collected only at the Organizer's office within 30 days after the event ends.
8. The Organizer reserves the right to introduce additional prizes in categories selected by the Organizer.

Publication of Data and Nature of Participation

1. The public publication of results, including at least the participant's first name, last name, country, club, and age category, is an integral part of the sporting competition and represents the essence of the event. The official public results serve as the historical record of the event.
2. Each Athlete, during registration, makes a choice regarding the public disclosure of their data in the official results and the start list.
3. Athletes who consent to the publication of their data take part in the Race under standard conditions, are included in all relevant classifications and are eligible to receive awards.
4. Athletes who do not consent to the public disclosure of their data will be automatically assigned to the "Anonimowy" category or similar.
5. Athletes assigned to the category referred to in point 4:
 - a. Take full part in the Race and are entitled to all Organizer's services, including time measurement.
 - b. Upon finishing the Race within the time limit, they receive a commemorative medal.
 - c. Their result (finish time) will be recorded, but in the official results lists they will appear under the identifier "Zawodnik Anonimowy" (or similar), without a placement number.
 - d. They will not be classified in any category and are not entitled to awards.
9. Choosing not to consent to the publication of data is equivalent to accepting the participation rules described in point 5 and constitutes a final decision to withdraw from competitive participation in favor of recreational participation

XII. PERSONAL DATA PROTECTION

1. The personal data of athletes is administered by Sport Evolution Group Sp. z o.o., Jana Kochanowskiego 12/23, 01-864 Warsaw, contact regarding personal data at: daneosobowe@sportevolution.pl.
2. The personal data of athletes will be processed for the purpose of organizing and conducting the event, determining the winner, awarding, issuing, receiving, and settling the prize, as well as other activities related to the conducted business.

3. To perform time measurement, create results, send information about the start number, and the achieved result, athlete data will be provided to the company responsible for timekeeping during the event.
4. The athlete has the right to access and correct their data. Providing personal data and giving consent to their processing is voluntary but necessary to achieve the above-mentioned purposes. Failure to provide data or lack of consent to their processing prevents participation in the competition. Please note that the given consent can be revoked at any time; however, revocation does not affect the lawfulness of data processing prior to withdrawal.
5. The processing of athlete data, in connection with participation in the event, also includes the publication of the athlete's name, year of birth, club affiliation along with the name of the place of residence—in any way the project will be published.
6. All information about participants obtained by the organizer and included in the registration form will be electronically stored and used in accordance with applicable legal regulations.
7. The organizer reserves the right to conduct interviews with each participant, take photos and film them for advertising, promotional, internet, radio-television broadcast, and other commercial purposes.
8. The organizer reserves the right to use free of charge worldwide all photos, film materials, interviews, and sound recordings depicting competition participants. They may be used by the organizer by placing them on CD-ROMs, DVDs, portable devices such as pendrives or external drives, cloud services, in catalogs, and media, on websites, in newspapers, and exhibitions, as well as for promotional and advertising purposes related to the organizer's activities.
9. The data retention period is as follows:
 - a. For data processed for the purpose of pursuing potential legal claims—until the claim is time-barred or the proceedings related to pursuing claims are concluded.
 - b. For data processed to document conducted activities and inform about them—no more than 5 years from the date of the documented event, unless the data is processed for archival purposes in the public interest.
 - c. For data processed to ensure the security of networks and IT systems—no more than 5 years from the date of registration.
 - d. For data processed based on the participant's consent—until the consent is withdrawn.
10. To withdraw consent for the processing of personal data, the participant should complete the form available at <https://slotmarket.pl/document/polityka-prywatnosci> and send it to contact@slotmarket.pl.

XIII. COMPLAINTS

1. Complaints related to event matters should be submitted in writing along with a justification to the organizer's correspondence address, marked "Kids Run Gdynia - Complaint," within 7 days from the date of the event—either in person, by registered mail (postmark date determines), or to the email address: biuro@gdyniapolmaraton.pl with the subject " Kids Run Gdynia – Complaint”.
2. Complaints submitted after the deadline specified in point 1 of Chapter XIII will not be considered.
3. The organizer will review complaints about the event within 14 days from the date of their receipt.
4. The Organizer's decision on complaints about the event will be final.
5. The above does not limit the Consumer's rights to pursue claims based on the absolutely applicable provisions of the law before the common courts.

XIV. FINAL PROVISIONS

1. This regulation applies to all participants of the event.
2. The regulation is effective from January 1, 2026.
3. Each participant in the event is obligated to familiarize themselves with the regulation.
4. Lack of knowledge of the competition regulation does not exempt the participant from the rules specified by the organizer in this regulation.
5. In case of non-compliance with any point of the regulation, the athlete may be denied entry to the event or disqualified during the competition or after its event.
6. Bringing intoxicants, illegal performance-enhancing substances, and alcohol to the event venue is prohibited. Athletes are prohibited from taking such substances both before and during the event, under the threat of exclusion. In the event that a athlete is found to violate this prohibition, the organizer reserves the right to deny them participation in the event or exclude them during the event.
7. The organizer provides emergency medical care on the course and at the finish line.
8. Each athlete is required to place the race number on the front, at chest height, under the penalty of disqualification.
9. The reverse side of the race number will contain a table that each athlete should fill out for easier identification in case of an accident. The table includes information about taken medications, possible allergies, and a phone number of a person the organizer should contact in case of an accident.
10. The organizer is not responsible for items lost during the event.

11. The organizer reserves the right to change the name of the event.
12. The binding and final interpretation of this regulation belongs solely to the organizer of the event. If any provision of the regulation is partially or entirely changed, all other provisions remain valid.
13. Matters not covered by the regulation are decided by the organizer based on applicable legal regulations. The above does not limit the right to legal action in the event of a dispute.
14. None of the points in the Rules exclude the organiser's responsibility that comes from the mandatory provisions of law.

XV. REGULATIONS RELATED TO FORCE MAJEURE

1. In the event of cancellation due to a pandemic or other state of threat or emergency, as well as due to factors beyond the organizer's control (so-called "force majeure"), the athlete will receive a voucher, equivalent to the paid entry fee, to be used for event held in the following year, or the participant will have the option to receive the entry fee within the timeframe specified by the organizer.
2. In the event of a change in the event date due to a pandemic or other state of threat or emergency, as well as due to factors beyond the organizer's control (so-called "force majeure"), the athlete will be transferred to the new competition date based on the agreement concluded with the organizer. The athlete will have the opportunity to apply for a refund of the entry fee within the timeframe specified by the organizer.
3. In the event of the cancellation or rescheduling of the event due to a pandemic or other state of threat or emergency, as well as due to factors beyond the organizer's control (so-called "force majeure"), money for purchased additional services will be refunded to the participant within 180 days. The purchased insurance is not subject to a refund.
4. Force majeure, within the meaning of these Regulations, encompasses all unforeseeable situations or events of an exceptional nature beyond the control of the organizer, preventing the fulfillment of any of the obligations specified in these Regulations, not resulting from the organizer's error or negligence, and remaining insurmountable despite exercising all due diligence, in particular: events of natural disasters such as floods, hurricanes, extraordinary force winds, tornadoes, earthquakes, exceptionally intense and prolonged downpours, or extraordinary and external events that could not be prevented (such as war, martial law restrictions, uprising, revolution, riots, terrorist attacks), epidemic threats, states of epidemic threat, epidemics, and states of epidemic, as well as new legal acts or decisions of administrative authorities preventing the Organizer from fulfilling its obligations. Neither the organizer nor the participants are liable for non-performance or improper performance of the provisions of these Regulations caused by force majeure.
